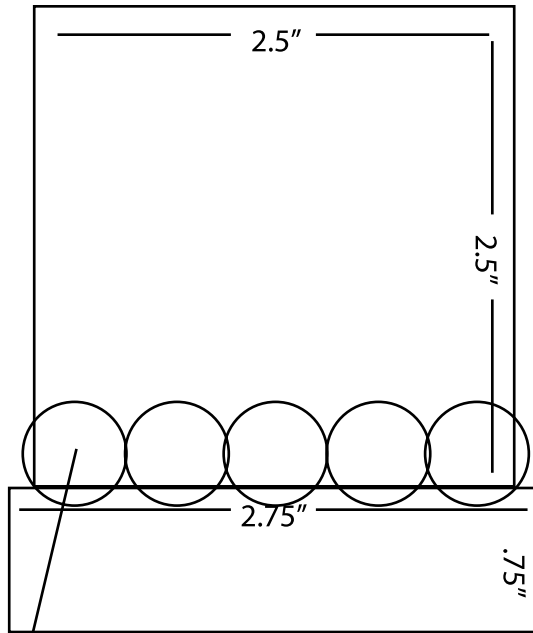


Before beginning, see our instructions for prepping your game board.
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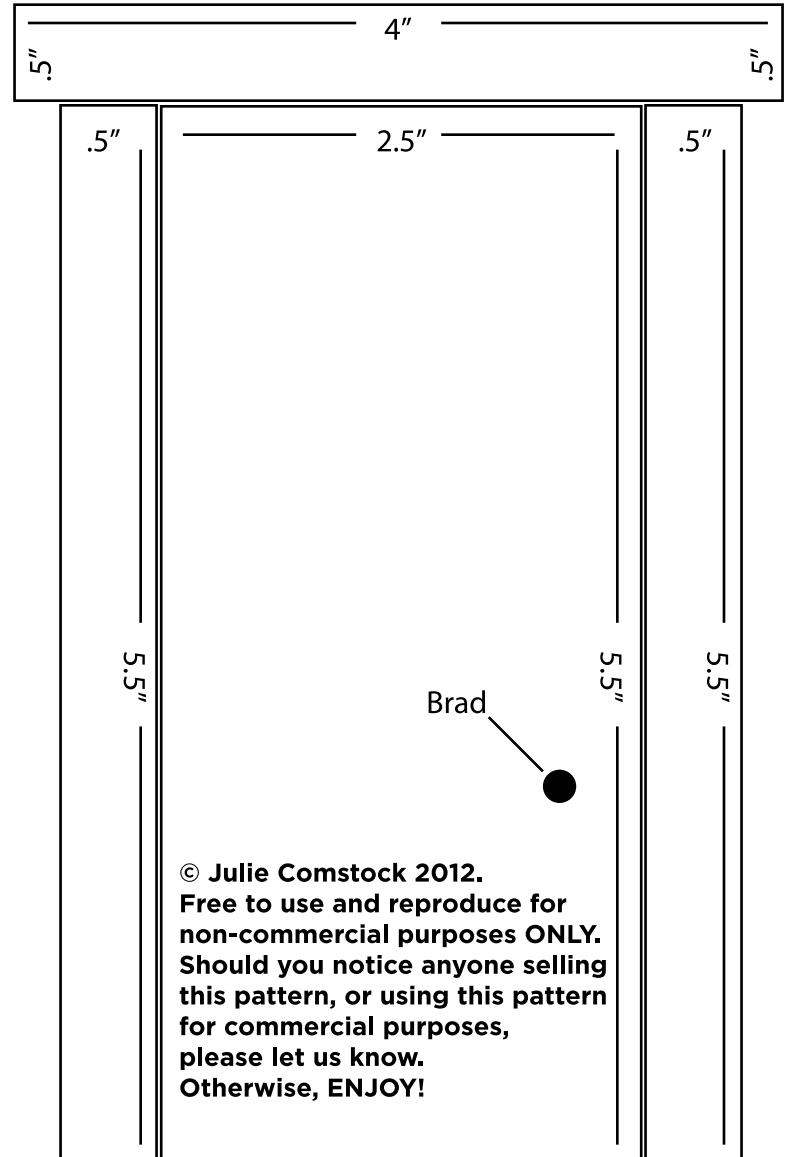
Front Exterior

1. Cover front of game board with paper (I used S'more Love papers). My board measured 9.25" square.
 2. Cover the living room with main paper also.
 3. Cut window using a cork backed ruler and craft knife.
 4. Cut door. Cut the hinged side from the living room, be careful, not to go all the way through.
 5. Cut other pieces as indicated.
 6. Layer roof tiles, starting at the top. (See above.)
- Place adhesive along upper edge only. Overlap as you go.
 Trim excess.



If you add flowers,
 Keep in mind the backs
 will show through into
 the living room window.

 I used chipboard flowers
 from Evangline.



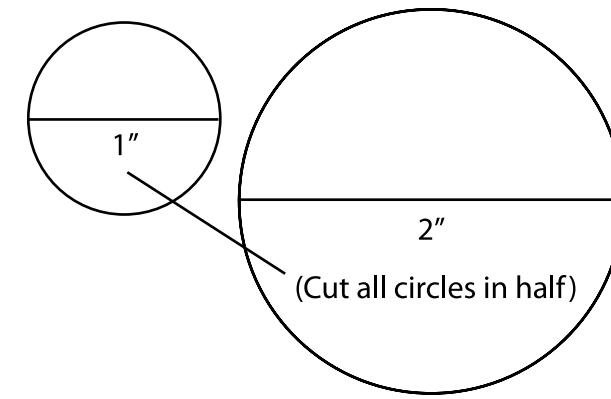
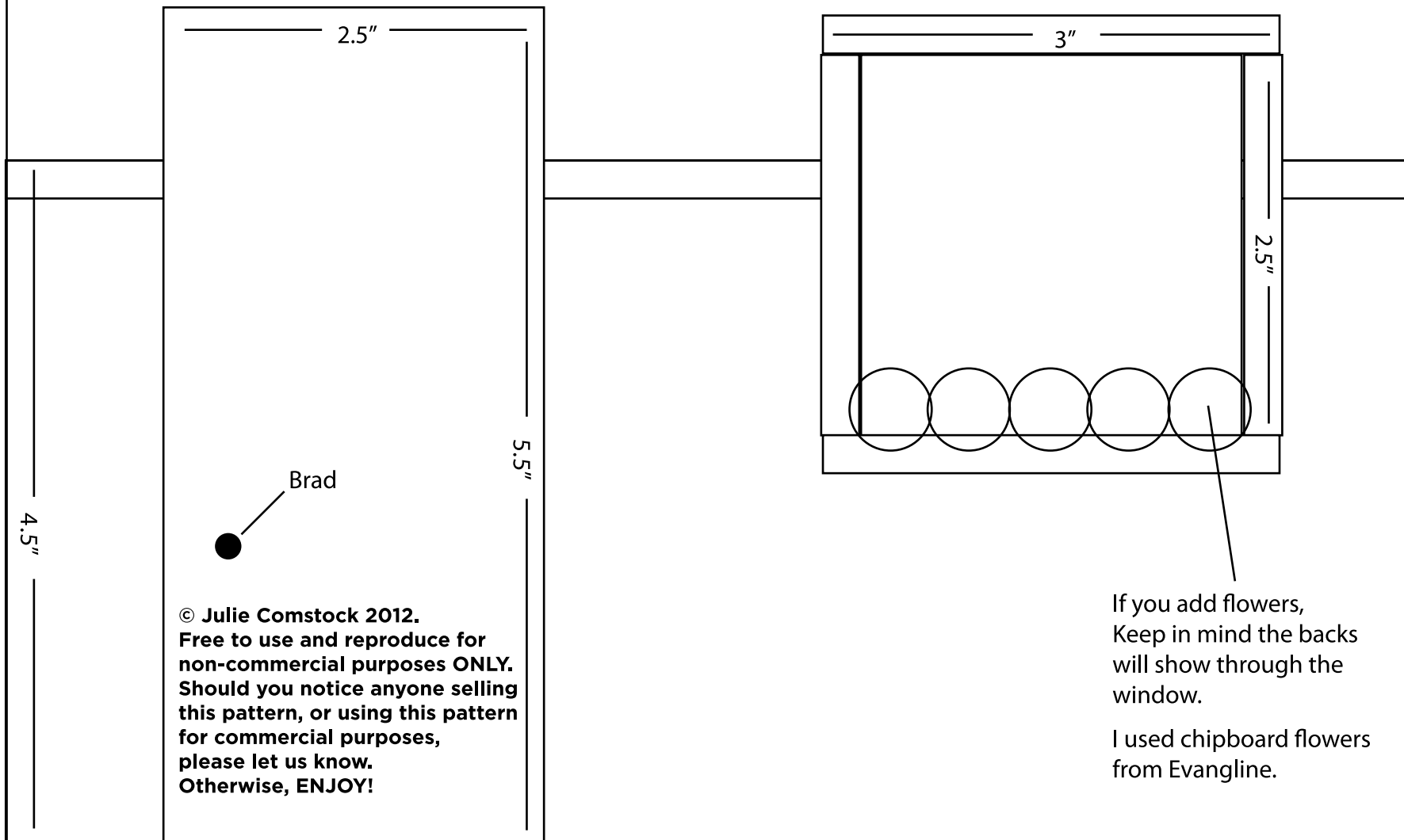
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Living Room

I used Tea for Two papers for this room.

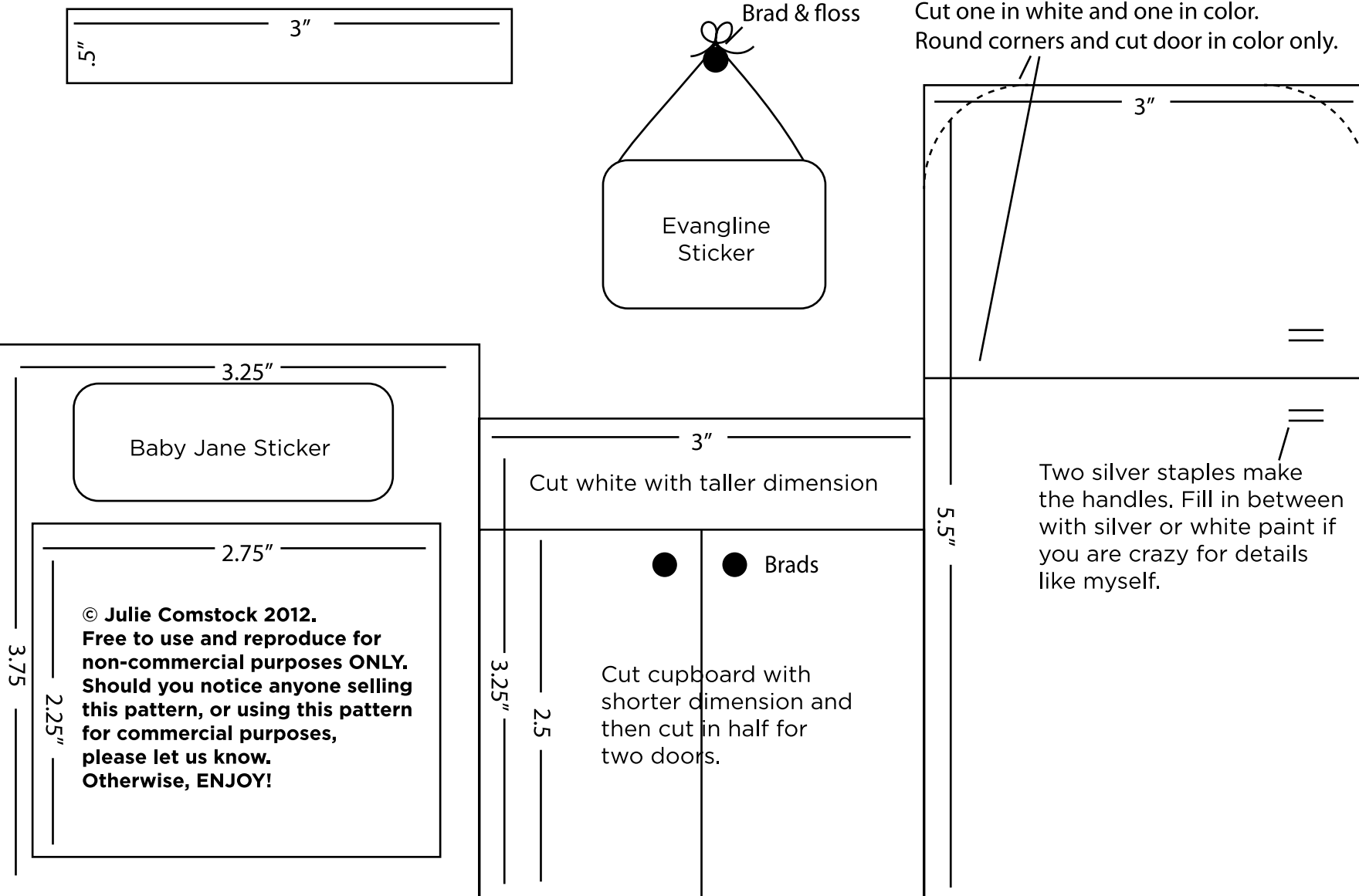
1. Add wainscott. Mine was 4.5" x 9.25". Your board may be different in size, so measure for width.
2. Add chair rail and window frame. Cut a strip of paper .25" adhere and trim as you go between door and window. For window frame, follow measurements.
3. Cover door and add brad.
4. Decorate walls. I used the Tea Tins paper from Tea for two, fussy cutting the frames. I filled in the frames with stickers from Tea for Two.
5. Details!!! Use brads and floss to make hanging pictures. Have fun with it!

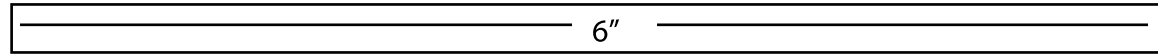


Kitchen

I used Tea for Two papers for the wall, cupboard & bowels and Baby Jane papers for the appliances.

1. Cover background with "wallpaper"
2. Starting on one edge, add appliances and cupboards. Follow directions on template. For the fridge and cupboard doors, add adhesive down edge, then score along adhesive with the backside of a craft knife. Adhere and then fold back along score line.
3. Decorate with bowls and picture frame. Tea for Two has chipboard saucers, teacups and teapots that would be cute!
4. If desired add velcro dots inside fridge, cupboard and oven, then make removeable food.

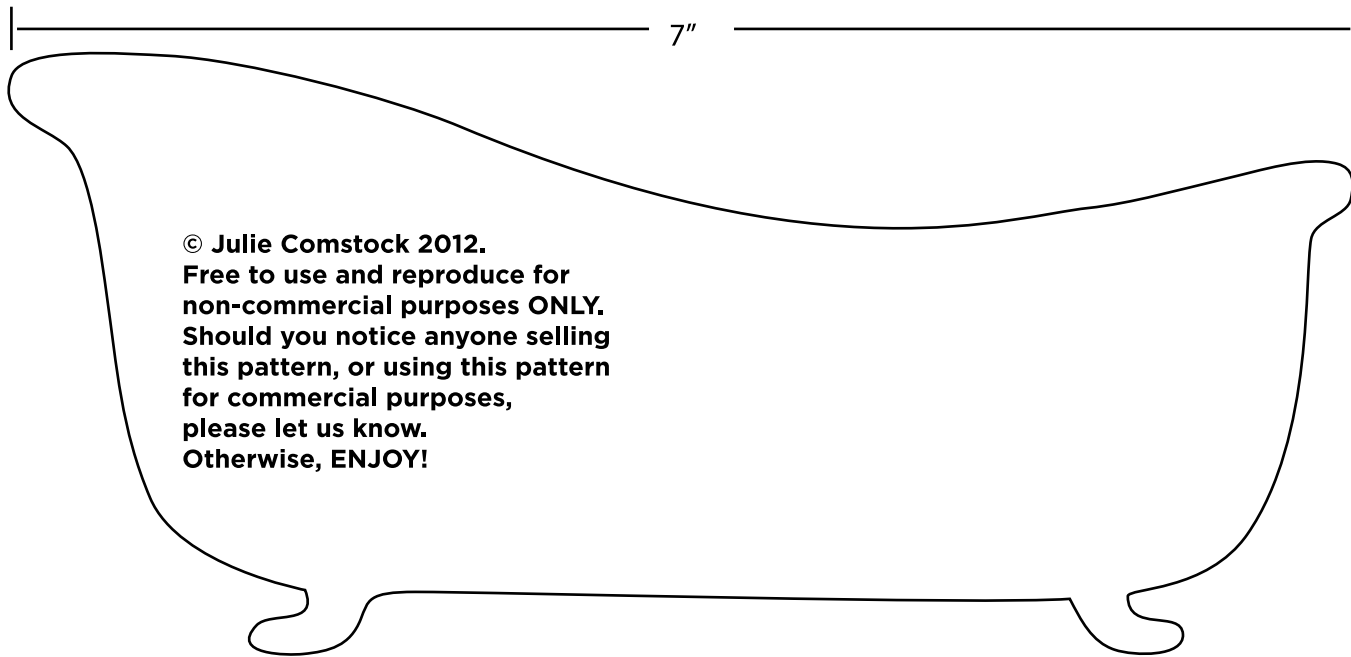




Bathroom

I used Baby Jane papers

1. Cover background with "wallpaper"
2. Add wainscott.
3. Cover seam with a border sticker. Mine came from the Tea for Two sticker set.
4. Use template to cut bath tub out of white cardstock. Adhere.
5. I used a Gluber strip and tulle (about 6.5" x 12") to make my shower curtain. I think clear vinyl would be awesome though!
6. I covered the edge of the curtain with a sticker from Baby Jane, however, it does not like to stick to the tulle, so I had to use some hot glue with it. If you get the vinyl, maybe the sticker would stay put?
7. Add bubbles to the bath. I used chipboard shapes from Baby Jane.

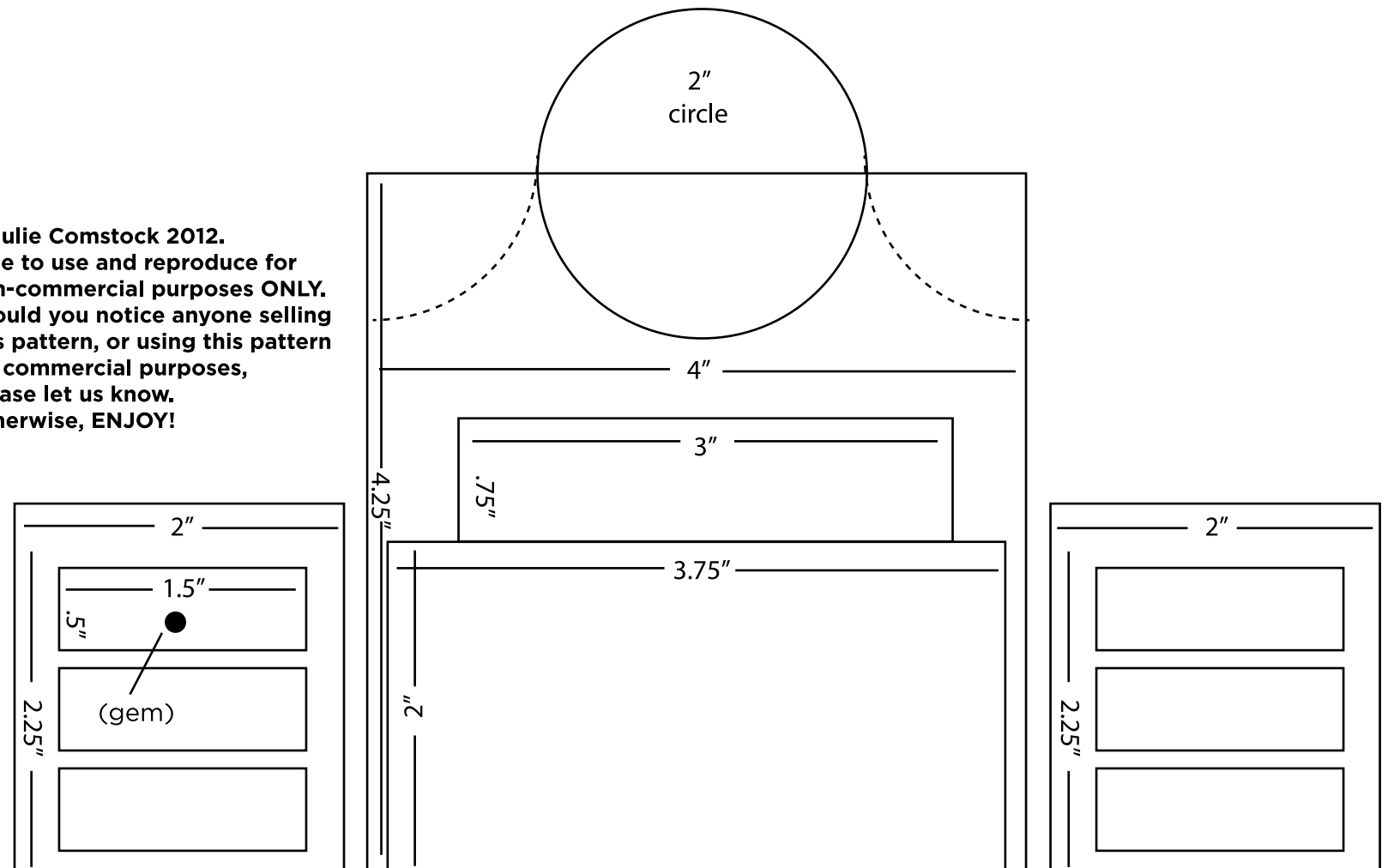


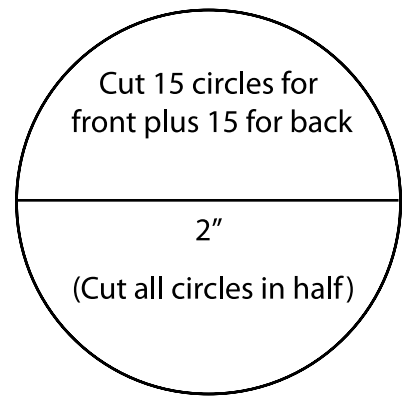
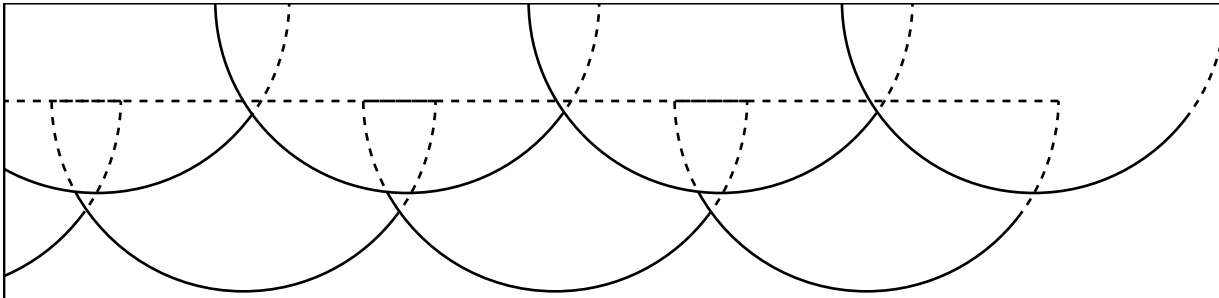
Bedroom

I used Baby Jane papers

1. Cover background with "wallpaper"
2. Cut bed. I made mine with a rectangle of cardstock with an added circle on top. I then used the circle punch to shape the corners of the rectangle. You can just use my pattern as a template if you like.
3. Add the mattress and pillow. Put something decorative in the center of the headboard. I used a 3-D sticker from Baby Jane.
4. Make and adhere the dressers. I used gems for the drawer pulls.

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Back Exterior

1. Cover with paper (I used S'more Love papers). My board measured 9.25" square.
2. Cut roof pieces as indicated.
3. Layer roof tiles, starting at the top. (See above.)

Place adhesive along upper edge only. Overlap as you go.

Trim excess.

4. If desired, add landscaping with chipboard flowers, grass, etc. Or maybe a garage?

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
